

The Premie Baby Boy's Bonnet

Presenting a premie-sized baby boy's bonnet for smocking or not! Sizes included for 1 pound to 5 pounds. The pattern includes three smocking design plates and a plain insert for those who wish to embellish or embroider, not smock. It is just waiting for you to stitch. An excellent project for the Wee Care Program.

Suggested fabrics: Imperial batiste, Swiss batiste or similar light weight fabric. This is a very tiny bonnet requiring fine fabric to work.

Materials:

1/3 yd. (0.6m) light weight fabric for 1 bonnet e.g. Imperial Batiste

1/8 yd. medium weight interfacing

1/2 yd. (0.5m) Ribbon, 3/8" (1.0cm) wide

Optional:

1 yd. (0.9m) *micro* piping (or #10 crochet cotton to make your own)

1 pkg. *Totally Stable*® iron-on tear away fabric stabilizer or similar generic product if smocking

Sewing thread to match fabric; scissors; pinking shears; fine hand sewing needle; pins; tissue and pencil for tracing pattern or a sheet of quilters' template plastic; sewing machine and zigzag foot.

Suggested additional machine feet: 1/4" quilting ft. (makes working with these tiny pieces a bit easier), 7 groove tucking ft. if piping is being made or used, edge/joining ft.

To smock: pleater or dots; gathering thread; embroidery floss or #8 Pearle cotton; embroidery/crewel needles.



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
